

This Level 6 module aims to provide you with the relevant knowledge, skills and competence to understand the complexities of the Irish tax system in relation to PAYE income and to be able to calculate complex payroll data manually and through a computerised payroll system.

The course provides a solid foundation in business, with expert guidance to help you explore career options in areas such as manufacturing, finance, and the public sector.

Students are registered with SETU from Year 1 and have full access to university services. Transport to Carlow is provided in Years 1 and 2 for cross-campus workshops.

Eligibility

Those wishing to be accepted onto the programme should meet the following minimum entry criteria:

- Leaving Certificate; 2H5 & 406/
- H7; including English or Irish 06/H7;
- Mathematics 06/H7, or
- Level 5 major award, or
- Other qualifications equivalent to a major award at level 5 on the NFQ

However, we will also accept your application if you are aged 21 or over but do not meet the minimum entry requirement. Your application will be assessed based on merit, taking into account your life experience, work or community experience.

If your first language is not English, the standard required is B2 (or equivalent)

on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages in writing, reading, listening and speaking. Evidence of achievement of this standard is necessary for entry to the programme.

Entry Requirements

Applicants should be of Leaving Certificate standard or have achieved an Applied Leaving Certificate with Distinction. Portlaoise Institute welcomes applications from mature students. Mature students are assessed on their merits and may not require the above qualifications.

All applicants are required to complete an online assessment and interview before commencing a Further Education course in Portlaoise Institute.

As well as the entry requirements specified here, there are additional entry requirements for some programmes. Further details are outlined in the relevant course pages.

Course Duration

All full-time courses run for one academic year, September to May.

Part-time courses either run from September to December or January to May.

Garda Vetting

All programmes have a mandatory Work Experience or Professional Placement module. All learners for certain courses must be Garda vetted before being permitted on work placements.

Fees

The cost of the majority of full-time courses is €50. To secure a place on a

course, this non-refundable fee must be paid within 3 weeks of when a place is offered on a course. Other costs (books, uniforms, exam fees, additional training etc.) may also be payable. These costs vary according to course and will be outlined at Induction.

Attendance

At Portlaoise Institute, we firmly believe that consistent and active attendance is fundamental to ensuring students achieve their full potential. Regular attendance supports academic success.

To help students understand the importance of this, our detailed attendance policy will be clearly outlined during the Induction session. This policy is designed to set expectations, highlight the connection between attendance and achievement, and ensure students are aware of the support available to help them maintain good attendance.

Student Services

Guidance Counselling

At Portlaoise Institute, students can avail of the services of a comprehensive Career Guidance Service by booking an appointment with our Guidance Counsellors.

Our service is student centered and aims to assist students with all aspects of career planning and the transition to higher education and/or the world of work. We aim to help students through individual or group appointments, careers and progression workshops,

and guest speakers from both the world of work and Higher Education Institutes (HEIs). We also provide a support service for students in the area of CV preparation, interview techniques and job search skills. Applicants with special requirements should notify the Institute at time of application and at induction and arrange to speak to the Student Support Officer. Placements normally take place in February. If your application to work aboard is successful, you will qualify for a grant towards the cost of the mobility programme including travel, accommodation and living expenses.
